Tonight’s gladrags are a purple tie-dye shirt with his trademark rainbow tank top (well, it may be truer to refer to this as his old trademark tank top as there’s a new bad-boy in town...the one knitted by Amanda during the pandemic, with bright rainbow stripes at chest level. Scott’s worn this one a lot at various gigs and festivals in recent months).

Playing The Edgar Winter Group’s Frankenstein, he quips: “Anybody remember Edgar Winter? Bit of an odd lookin’ chap ‘e was. But yeah, crackin’ bit o music.”

Gail Something-Else is on the chat thread. She has ‘the lurgy’. Scott mentions there’s a new Covid strain starting to do the rounds (Omicron). Luckily, Gail doesn’t have that.

Scott promises ‘all sorts of madness’ including footage from 2021’s Underneath The Stars festival.

He’s been playing live with the Levellers this week (Morecambe and Sheffield Leadmill) and is looking forward to the Nottingham Rock City gig...but has some reservations due to reports of Omicron in the area.

"I'm not gonna lie, it's absolutely chuffin' Baltic outside," says Scott as he begins this week's aftershow. To demonstrate, he opens the door of The Pint & Puppet, revealing a snow-covered lawn.

Meanwhile, Amanda is busy doing her usual putting the puppets to bed routine.

There are 47 viewers a couple of minutes in.

Puppet Morris has a green fur moustache for Movember. "Oooh, it's gotta come off. It just looks wrong!" Amanda exclaims.

A fan named Warren has made a Lego Scott, complete with guitar, which is currently sat on the bar next to Morris. Scott thinks he did it using a 3D printer.

Scott and Amanda have two electric fires on in the pub due to the cold. "If Greta Thunberg was watchin' at the minute, she'd be chuffin' disgusted at us with our two fires," says Scott.

He spends a bit of time tuning his guitar, which doesn't do well in the cold.

Scott and Amanda thank Matt and Ali Caldwell who sent them some flowers earlier in the week.

There are 59 people watching at around nine minutes in.

Duran Duran's Rio is the first song, followed by Rory Gallagher's Too Much Alcohol.

Sue Devine from Red Ruff was spotted briefly on the chat thread. They were tonight's main show guests and sang a haunting rendition of We Shall Wear Midnight with Scott. Red Ruff introduced him to Steeleye Span's Wintersmith album, from which the song was taken. The album features author Terry Pratchett as a guest musician and is inspired by his novel of the same name.

The next song is dedicated to Tom Jackson from Shanghai Treason as he recently caught Covid while running a merch stall at a gig. It's Bruce Springsteen's Born to Run.

Scott and Amanda bought a new sign for the Pint & Puppet for £20, it features a toucan holding a large bottle of Guinness and says, 'Opening Time Is Guinness Time'.

Jon Shanks requests some Queen to mark the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Freddie Mercury's death. Scott thinks for a moment, then glides effortlessly into Radio Ga Ga.

The next song is dedicated to Gail Something-Else. He mentions that Gail and her band, Muddy Summers & The Dirty Field Whores, will be playing at the Doonicans' panto in December. Scott says he saw her in the crowd at a recent gig he did in Sheffield, supporting the Levellers.

Big Neet Out, The Album news: Scott is almost ready to ship the albums out to everyone. He says there's a video streaming key on the cover that will allow people who've bought the CD to watch the whole show. However, the footage won't be available until 8pm on Boxing Day, when Scott and Amanda plan to hold a watch party.

Big Neet Out number 2 is scheduled back at The Lantern Theatre in Sheffield on the 12<sup>th</sup> November 2022. Tickets go on sale tomorrow at 10am.

Next up it's the New York Fund's Nobody Home.

Scott announces a few festivals the Doonicans will be doing next year, including Beardy Folk, Bearded Theory, Cropredy and Watchet. Scott is particularly excited about Watchet as his schoolboy crush, the legendary Belinda Carlisle, will be there.

Final song is the Levellers' One Way.

Scott goes and sits next to Amanda. He says he's finding live shows quite exhausting after not touring for over a year. Although he is loving being back out on the road again.

Ends, Scott: "If we don't see yer threwt week, we'll see yer threwt winder."
