Scott says he's already stuck a couple of beers in the van for later: "Yes, I am a piss 'ed I'm sorry Nick...it (*shakes head, cheeky smile*)...it happens. It's lockdown innit...it's just...it's not good fer...er... people who like a drink, like meself."

Short and sweet this one.

Scott says bye with Eliza still breezing through the air.

BNI #36 has been "pretty epic", it's already ten to eleven as the aftershow starts.

He responds to viewers on the chat threat.

Amanda's drinking Yorkshire Gin Cream Liqueur tonight, a gift from fans Si and Sharon Carter. She holds up the elegant black bottle with a gold and black label.

Scott says Greenday's Billy Joe Armstrong once did a punky version of the first aftershow song, which the Doonicans also covered in their early days. It's I Think We're Alone Now, probably better known as being sung by teen popstrel Tiffany back in the late 80s.

The Doonicans have a live album coming out on Bandcamp on Friday called Only Us, Keith Richards And Cockroaches Left.

Tired Of Waiting by The Kinks is up next.

Then, a Simon & Garfunkel number – Mrs Robinson.

There are 115 watching at around fourteen minutes in.

The dad of a 7-year-old fan says on the chat his son can't understand why he's not allowed to sing 'The Twitcher Song' (The Ornithologist Waltz) on his way to school. A big chuckle from Scott follows.

Final song of the evening: Louis Armstrong's What A Wonderful World.

Scott puts down his guitar, goes and sits next to Amanda. We learn her mum's funeral took place earlier in the week. She explains she got a bit upset when she saw Scott's dedication to Rita at the end of the main show as she wasn't expecting it. She thanks fans for their kind messages and says Rainbow Connection was played at the funeral.

"Love to y'all...ta-ra!" says Scott. Amanda waves.
