Scott says he's readying himself for a Christmas BNI. He thinks it's incredible he's still doing them and there's 50 odd people watching currently.

Regina Watson, Bjorn's step-grandma appears on the thread.

Amanda's mum is still in hospital with sepsis and cellulitis, but she's fighting and is doing better this week.

"I should have been in Beverley tonight," says Scott, adding a bit of blue to the evening.

In fact, he should have been doing a solo show at The Monk's Walk pub, in Beverley, East Yorkshire. Also, Bostin' Days should have been happening today, a festival some of Scott's friends were set to play at.

Scott notices Emu isn't where he needs to be for the main show...picks him up, chucks him across the room...poor Emu :)

"Have fun. See you all later. Ta-ra!"

Scott waits for fans to arrive on the Facebook aftershow thread.

Gail Something-Else pops in. She's now doing Deserted In Lockdown Discs on Mondays at 8pm on MixCloud. Scott hopes to be on her show at some point. Gail is frontwoman of Muddy Summers & The Dirty Field Whores.

Tim Ashton from 3 Daft Monkeys also pops in.

Scott says not only are musicians viable (despite the Government implying otherwise), they're also very adaptable, as proven by the many online shows/podcasts etc. that have materialised due to the pandemic.

Some performer friends have managed to get out doing some socially distanced live shows, while other more medically vulnerable ones haven't and have stuck with their online gigs.

Scott says he doesn't have any underlying health conditions, except his liver is about to drop out of his arse due to "my own endeavours" (enjoying a beer or three, maybe more).

Gail Something-Else quips: "It's like a rock n' roll respite home in here tonight."

"It really is," says Scott, laughing.

Tom Rylance from The Lottery Winners appears on the chat.

First song: I'll Never Fall In Love Again (Composer, Burt Bacharach / Lyrics, Hal David. Famously sung by Dionne Warwick).

Second, a Joe Jackson song that Scott used to perform in a band with his sister and two brothers.

The version they did was inspired by American comedian Denis Leary. He did MTV Unplugged, and happened to start the show with the song in question, sung a capella. Scott's band slid the a capella version into one with guitar and bass and really liked it. It's: Is She Really Going Out With Him? First line is: "Pretty women out walking with gorillas down my street"I mean, I'm intrigued already, are you?

Next up, a medley in tribute to puppet Gloria. In the Doonicans' early days, Scott did a cover of Van Morrison's Brown Eyed Girl on YouTube and Van's 'people' pulled it down saying it infringed copyright. So, he's got his fingers crossed they won't pull down the song he's about to do now...and if they do "It's been nice knowing y'all".

Of Van Morrison he says: "He is the grumpiest bastard in rock." Apparently, this is well documented. The Doonicans were on the same bill as Van Morrison at Wickham this year and Scott would have tried to see him live there as he does have some appreciation for him. His dad was a big fan and used to know him back in the day at some of Belfast's jazz clubs, but when they saw him, Van

Morrison seemed a bit non-plussed and kept wandering off stage. Scott thinks he may have been hard done to by the music industry...seemed a bit peed off with it.

And then: Moondance by Van Morrison.

Van (Real name, George Ivan Morrison...thank you Wikipedia. He's a Sir and OBE, don't you know!) failed to shut Scott down, so BNI Aftershow #30 is still broadcasting!

Following the Van Morrison adventure, Scott decides to 'Keep It Light' with a spot of A-ha...can't go wrong with that!

Take On Me rings out on guitar...ah, lovely! Bless you Morten, Pal (with a dot on the 'a' that I can't make happen on my laptop!), and Magne x

Scott thinks some Doonifans may have made friends online during the pandemic who may never have met in real life. He thinks there's something positive about that.

Gail Something-Else comments that the support network through the grassroots festival community has been amazing.

Scott and Amanda ask any musicians who would like to be interviewed by a Scottish puppet (Gloria), to get in touch.

Alan's in Tier 1 at the moment in Bolsover, and isn't on lockdown, unlike other areas.
