Gloria is back in Barnsley from her trip to Scotland.

Alan is an expectant Grandad for the second time.

Future BNI's will just be broadcast on YouTube and not Facebook as well.

Bjorn is a big Paul McCartney fan.

Scott mentions building work in the Garage he's been doing for the past 3 weeks (This will be the start of The Pint & Puppet)

Amanda holds up signs saying "Sheep go to Devon" and "Goats go to Hull" in "Sheep Go To Heaven" – Scott sings those lyrics at the end of the song.

Scott cues the "All The Dinner Ladies" backing instead of the "Alan, Alan, Alan" chant during "Festival Heroes".

PJ Bryant has sent Scott an Ivor Big Neet In Award 2020 Best Television Soundtrack Scott Doonican which Amanda surprises Scott with before "The Road".

There is a spoof ad for Mane 'n Tail proud sponsors of Scott Doonican's BIG NEET IN which Alan had introduced in his interview and had been a running gag throughout this episode.

Records Played:

Fleetwood Mac

General:

A black record with an orange centre spins on the turntable this evening. It's a pacey number, by Fleetwood Mac in tribute to Peter Green who passed away today.

Roll call saying "hi" to fans.

Eliza Carthy makes an appearance on the chat thread.

Scott says he's always wanted to play Blackpool Opera House 1) it looks like a lovely room 2) Val Doonican has played there.

A rather self-deprecating Scott says he's not a dextrous guitar player: "I'm not the Angus Young or the Slash of the world, I'm just what I am...erm...which is generally an idiot in, in a tank top an' bad hair."

More shout outs and chat.

Scott responds to one comment saying he would love to have seen both Peter Green and Rory Gallagher while they were alive.

One fan, Robert Potter, says he had a folk badge which said "Dancing is a vertical expression of a horizontal desire"...Scott likes this.

The conversation turns to American alt-rock band, Cake. Scott recommends checking them out.

Next, he searches for his two favourite Fleetwood Mac tracks: Shake Your Moneymaker and Need Your Love So Bad.

Scott's on the Stella tonight and has 6 bottles of Proper Job in the van.

General:

Scott opens with a wide exaggerated grin. Sits next to Amanda who is holding a conical shaped award with a stylish slit down the side. It's been sent in by PJ Bryant for their services to BNI.

Roughly 180 were watching this evening at peak time.

Lady In Greggs is the first song played. As it reaches its crescendic climax, Scott manages to rock the suspension of the van by executing a dramatic (albeit slightly smaller than he would on stage) jump on the final beat.

7pm tomorrow on Facebook...Scott's doing a special interview.

In the early days of the Doonicans, Scott was in another band with his real-life brothers and sister. They used to do quirky covers of artists other bands rarely covered. One of these covers was Shake Your Moneymaker by Fleetwood Mac. As mentioned in the pre-show, it's one of Scott's favourite Fleetwood Mac songs. He picks up his guitar, starts belting it out.

Scott is planning a Cropredy special for BNI #21, which falls when the festival should have been taking place. He says when the Doonicans played there it was a "mindblowing situation" to be put in front of 20,000 people.

Amanda wonders whether Alan uses Mane 'N Tail on his succulents.

After playing Tom Jones' Delilah, Jon Shanks messages in with a joke which Amanda reads out: "Went to the doctors as I couldn't stop singing Green Green Grass Of Home. He told me I was suffering from Tom Jones syndrome. I asked if it was a common complaint. He said...'It's not unusual'."

Badum TISH!

A slightly tipsy Scott tells fans he and Amanda love them. Amanda says he's turning into "Rambling Willie Ramsbottom," urges him to say goodnight :)
