General:

After 8 weeks of zipping up and down the country to festivals, Scott's back home in Barnsley for Big Neet In #70.

He's looking positively spiffing in a purple/pink mottled tank top with bright rainbow stripes across the middle, knitted across the pandemic by his good lady wife, Amanda (actually, they're not married, but are as good as). Adorning the tank top are two badges: Dennis the Menace and one featuring a black cross on white, with the letters S D H C (which I believe stand for Scott Doonican Hardcore) and are a nod to Frank Turner's logo.

A jaunty number from Show Of Hands' Battlefield Dancefloor plays in the background. Scott says he caught up with them at the As You Like It and Beautiful Days festivals.

He says how lovely it's been seeing lots of bands and fans over the summer.

53 people are watching the pre-show at around three minutes in.

Scott explains how putting Big Neets In together is a lot of work. Over the past few weeks of not doing them he's almost forgotten just how much is involved. He says he's had a lot more sleep as a result of not having to do them.

70 are tuned in around five minutes in. "I genuinely thought there'd be no bugger 'ere tonight," quips Scott, thinking fans might opt for either the pub or Strictly instead.

"So anyway, you lot av a smashin' night. Enjoy yerselves. Erm, yer know, play the Scott Doonican Drinking Game if yer want to...which is basically any time I say the word 'Cheers', you gotta neck a pint...see ow long yer last."

General:

Down in the old Pint & Puppet, Scott fiddles with a tuft of unruly hair on his wig while Amanda tries to remember where all the puppets go (they have specific places).

“I’ve forgot what order thee go in,” she says, staring at a shelf with some wooden puppet holders on.

“Gervais and Gloria go int middle,” says Scott.

He then does a close up of Amanda’s bag-for-life which is chock-full of puppets waiting to be put back. The pair now own so many, some of them have to live in Scott’s top floor music room. The upstairs puppets are Marcel Cousteau, Grandpa, Wallace and Bart Hat, amongst others. While Gloria, Gordon, The Devil, Gervais, Percy, Winonna, Morris, Ringo, Fairbanks, Sooty, Sweep, Cheeky Monkey, Frog, Shergar...and possibly more, live in the pub.

Scott says he felt a bit out of practice with tonight’s show.

Morris, the pub landlord, has sorted a beer for Scott, while Amanda is on rhubarb and ginger gin.

Scott dedicates the first aftershow song to Alan Partridge because it’s by A-ha. It’s 80s classic, Take On Me.

Next up is Miley Cyrus’ Midnight Sky, a song Scott did with Lil’ Jim during lockdown.

Amanda is on a snorting roll tonight. For those who aren’t aware, she snorts when she laughs...often, the more gin that’s involved, the more snorting :)

And now, Belinda Carlisle’s Heaven Is A Place On Earth.

Then it’s on to another song which Scott did as a lockdown collaboration. It’s Lady Gaga’s Bad Romance, which he did with Sound Of The Sirens.

The Divine Comedy’s National Express follows.

The final song is sung as a thank you to fans for tuning in. It’s Doris Day’s Dream A Little Dream Of Me.

Scott moves over to sit by Amanda. He says they've missed doing the Big Neets In, even though it's been lovely getting back out on the road again.

Next week is Big Neet Out at the Lantern Theatre in Sheffield. With just six days to go Scott reveals he and Amanda are still writing the show :) It's a small Victorian theatre, so to enable adequate ventilation to prevent the spread of Covid, doors will be left open. Scott and Amanda warn fans to wrap up warm.

A bit more chit chat follows, including Scott mentioning he and Amanda went to a ceilidh the week before for Lizzie Morris' 25th birthday and saying he did for ceilidh dancing what Matt Hancock did for the NHS.

Then, a cheesy grin to camera from Amanda as Scott struggles to switch it off.
