After Gordon McGlumpher’s special ‘Wee Neet In’ Scott and Amanda take a while to reappear on Facebook for the promised aftershow. On the chat threads, Doonifans are starting to wonder what has happened. After several tense minutes, the show begins. But tonight we are not in the Pint & Puppet as expected – instead, we are in Scott and Amanda’s living room.

“Oh, that was a bit of a debacle!” says puppet Gordon.

It turns out Scott and Amanda headed over to the Pint & Puppet, but once there couldn't pick up an internet connection – resulting in them having to make a mad dash with all their gear back into the house.

“I'll let you go, over to our Scott, who's looking a bit windswept and interesting,” says Gordon, handing over to Scott.

Scott explains what happened, then goes to retrieve Amanda's drink from the Pint & Puppet, while Amanda shows viewers the new tank top she's been knitting for him. It's black with a rainbow across the chest and a solid red bar around the bottom rim.

Scott reckons Storm Dudley (or Eunice) are to blame for the internet outage.

He last wore his mottled pastel-coloured tank top at Bearded Theory a few years back, where apparently it got covered in ice-cream. Amanda assures him it has been washed since then.

64 people are tuned in around 3 minutes in. Amanda says there were around 90 viewers of the main show at its most popular point.

It's revealed the pair are set to be an auntie and uncle again.

Scott has compiled the aftershow set list from fan requests. As he hunts for it Amanda as libs, scanning the living room and focusing on a Jeremy Cunningham Devil Went Darn To Barnsley linocut. It's a black and white original, and Scott explains that the J in Bjorn's name was accidentally cut back to front, requiring Photoshopping before publication.

The first song is 29 Times The Pain by The Wildhearts.

Scott switches from guitar to ukulele as he announces the next song for Lin Hulme's birthday. It's Binful Of Bottles. At the end he tells viewers to expect a full band version of it on the next Doonicans' album.

The Levellers' Far From Home is next up.

Scott tunes his guitar as it has fallen out of tune on the journey between The Pint & Puppet and the house.

Big Coffee Brand follows.

Viewers are then encouraged to have a mass debate (Scott's words underlined...filthy mind, evidently) about whether to go for a Queen song next or Stephen Lynch's Gerbil. The vote goes, hands down, to Gerbil. Burrow harder, burrow deeper, people! ; )

Amanda says she and Scott were watching Dogs Behaving (Very) Badly the other day, and the family featured in it had the same living room curtains as them.

Festival Heroes is next, requested by Helen Burchell, who wanted to dedicate it to anyone needing a boost.

The Doonicans' Winter Woollies tour went on sale yesterday and Devon has already sold out.

Half Man Half Biscuit's Paintball's Coming Home is next, followed by Flatpacks.

Then, it's a Wonder Stuff song which Amanda likes – it's Don't Let Me Down, Gently. The song builds to a fairly loud ending and Amanda reminds Scott to be careful of upsetting the neighbours. She's concerned they'll be able to hear through the wall.

Morris Dance is next. Puppet Morris shakes his bells in front of the camera.

Scott, readying himself for another guitar number, dons a whistle-supporting thingamajig that sits on his shoulders (no idea what the apparatus is called in actuality). He plays Whippin' Piccadilly by Gomez. Scott blows the whistle as Amanda pulls the end to make a slidy sound (this sounds all kinds of wrong; I know).

The next song is for Mim MacMahon, in memory of her friend who passed away this week. It's The Beatles' In My Life.

Then, it's The Broadside Ballad Of Maggie Gove – a new Doonicans' song which will appear on their soon-to-be released album, Rugh & Ryf.

The penultimate song of the night is Queen, Bohemian Rhapsody.

For a brief moment, Scott works Gordon the puppet while Amanda voices him – though he quickly spots that viewers can see in the mirror it's him with Gordon on his arm. The illusion is broken! It's further broken as Scott starts talking in his normal voice while moving the puppet's mouth.

Donations for tonight's show will help to pay for the Underneath The Stars video footage Scott has been using.

The final song is Morecambe & Wise's classic feel-good song, Bring Me Sunshine.

Scott thanks Gordon for his special 'Wee Neet In'.

Gordon says he's very tired and wishes everyone goodnight.

The next Big Neet In will be on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> March – an early St Patrick's Day celebration, due to the fact actual St Patrick's day is on a Thursday.
