First Appearance of

Scott has a choking fit at the start of “It Must Be Love”, we he restarts Amanda interrupts with loud choking/coughing sounds giving Scott the giggles.

Scott has another slip up pronouncing Cheeky Monkey at the end of the show causing Amanda to laugh.

Pre-Show Nerves : (Length: 06:40)

Records Played:

Tom Waits’ Raindogs album from 1985

General:

The gravelly tones of American singer-songwriter Tom Waits pulse through the air this evening as the pre-show opens. A black record spins on the turntable while Scott taps his feet to the beat.

“Evenin’ all. How y’all doin? It’s Satdee night...we finally got there. It’s finally the weekend...thank God for that. It’s been...it’s been quite the week.”

Scott hopes everyone’s “geared up” for a fun show.

He flashes Tom Waits’ Raindogs album cover: “What I love about Tom Waits is he goes from, yer know...a guttural scream to, yer know...a great balladeer as well.”

Shout outs to fans joining the chat thread.

Clad in his rainbow tank top with lilac tie-dye shirt and a small tuft of hair doing its own thing on his wig, Scott says it's been a bit of a shit week. But he says he's ready for a fun night and he and Amanda intend to keep things light.

Scott: "I know last week there was a little bit of a hoo-hah about somebody that wasn't all that keen on Gloria (*Looks into camera, shakes head*). All you have to do is just switch off at that point if you don't like it. Or, if you don't like me, switch off now...it's dead easy innit."

He laughs, carries on, reminds people how to find the main show on YouTube and encourages them to tell their friends. Continues: "It wasn't how I planned to spend me year, but...but hey, yer know. Thirty-five shows in n' you guys are still here so, yer know, I'm gonna...gonna give it me best shot."

Closing comments.

Cranks up Tom Waits.

Ends: "See yer in a bit...bye!"

General:

"All the cool kids are here," says Scott checking the aftershow thread.

Amanda says Scott's hair seems to have "taken flight".

Rain can be heard bucketing down outside and the two of them have rushed down to the van.

"Well, it's quite windy int it," Scott laughs.

Amanda takes the camera. She's wearing her happy banana socks again (shows everyone), says she's had hassle with her wisdom teeth this week.

The pop-tastic 60s classic, These Boots Are Made For Walkin' is played first. At the part where the lyrics go "Are you ready boots? Get walkin'" Amanda focuses the camera on Scott's slippered feet, mutters under her breath "Old man slippers" :)

"I may av got old man slippers on...I don't give a shit!" Scott retorts.

Apparently, when Bjorn joined the band he asked his mum and dad if they'd get him some old man shoes like Scott's. He wanted to feel part of the band properly. Amanda told him they were actually Scott's normal shoes. Thereafter, Bjorn, opted for trainers.

Big shout out to Keith Tatum from Mr Benn Productions who plays Frank Spencer and other characters. Scott suggests people book him as he “makes your festival richer”.

Up next, Frank Sinatra’s The Lady Is A Tramp.

Followed by Billy May’s Come Fly With Me.

Amanda picks up on fan Mim MacMahon’s comment: “I love Frank (*Sinatra*) except My Way which is the faeces of Satan.”

This prompts Scott to say he’s heard if you put the words/music to David Bowie’s Life On Mars over My Way it allegedly works.

I decided to Google this and discovered a convoluted story that goes something like this: The chords to both My Way and Life On Mars are in fact identical. In the 1960s it was common for European hits to be acquired by British or American publishers who would then arrange for them to be rewritten in English. It seems David Bowie wrote the first English lyrics to the original tune that eventually became My Way (the original tune coming from French song, Comme D’habitude by Claude Francois), a song he entitled Even A Fool Learns To Love. Bowie’s effort, however, was rejected by music producers, but later a Canadian songwriter named Paul Anka heard it, bought the rights and rewrote it as the My Way that became famous. Sadly for Bowie, this meant him missing out on a fortune. In retaliation, he then wrote and recorded Life On Mars as a Sinatra parody, angry at having missed out on so much money.

There’s contention regarding the Paper Lace question on tonight’s quiz. Scott had implied they were ‘one hit wonders’, but concedes they did in fact have three top ten hits. To remedy the fact that people may have lost out on a quiz point (shock horror!) he poses another question off the cuff:

What was the label Paper Lace were signed to?

Answer: Bus Stop.

Nick Johnson is the first fan to get the answer right.

Next song: Nowhere Man by The Beatles.

Then it’s REM’s very wordy It’s The End Of The World As We Know It.

Scott and Amanda open a cardboard box which has been sent by a fan who requested it be opened in the aftershow. It’s full of the kind of packaging that looks like Wotsits, stressing Scott out in case they go all over the van. He manages to retrieve a smaller box from inside without too much chaos. It’s a large glass tankard with the wording “Ivor Big Neet In Award 2020, New Pub Of The Year, The Pint & Puppet” and artist Paine Proffitt’s Pint & Puppet artwork etched into it. There’s also a nice wooden base for the tankard to be displayed on.

And now, Crowded House’s Weather With You.

Final song of the night: Whippin’ Piccadilly by Gomez.

Amanda says she got her banana socks from Lidl.

As she’s explaining this Scott is seen bending down attempting to clear the ‘Wotsits’ from the van floor. “There’s chuffin’ tons of it,” he jokes.

He and Amanda then sit next to each other for thank yous and goodnights.
